### **Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy**

Pope Francis has announced an 'Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy' year to commence on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (8<sup>th</sup> December 2015) and conclude on the Solemnity of Christ the King (20<sup>th</sup> November 2016).

"With the approach of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy I would like to focus on several points which I believe require attention to enable the celebration of the Holy Year to be for all believers a true moment of encounter with the mercy of God. It is indeed my wish that the Jubilee be a living experience of the closeness of the Father, whose tenderness is almost tangible, so that the faith of every believer may be strengthened and thus testimony to it be ever more effective."

### *Remembrance Day, 11<sup>th</sup> November*

Next Wednesday is Remembrance Day which marks the anniversary of the armistice which ended the First World War (1914–18). Each year Australians observe one minute silence at 11 am on 11 November, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts.

Red poppies are worn on blazers, shirts, jumpers and other items of clothing on Remembrance Day to remember those who died during a war. Poppies were among the first plants that came from the battlefields of northern France and Belgium during World War I. Some people believed the popular myth that poppies were rich in their redness because they blossomed from grounds that were covered with soldiers' blood.

On Wednesday at 11am we will gather as a school community to remember all the men and women who fought so bravely, those who suffered and those who have died. The students will wear poppies as a symbol of remembrance during our ceremony. We will pray for justice, freedom and peace and for the wisdom and strength to build a better world.

### Year 3 Family/Parish Mass

Our next Family/Parish Mass for this term will be celebrated on Sunday, 15th November, at 9.30am. All families, especially Year 3, are welcome. Mass will be followed by morning tea in the Parish House.

### **Religious Literacy Assessment**

Last term, students from Years 4 and 6 participated in the Religious Literacy Assessment. This assessment focussed on the key concepts being addressed in the Religious Education Program, 'Sharing Our Story' and the students' ability to make connections with Catholic traditions and religious life of the school and parish.

Students completed an online, multiple choice assessment consisting of 35 questions. These come under 7 categories: God, Jesus, Church, Prayer, Sacraments, Scripture and Christian Life.

We are proud of our students' results and congratulate them on their excellent efforts and achievements.

### CHANGES TO SCHOOL STUDENT TRANSPORT SCHEME

From Term 1 2016, Transport for NSW will be issuing School Opal cards to students eligible for travel under the School Student Transport Scheme via a new online application process.

#### Automatic renewal

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Most parents won't need to apply for a School Opal card if they have already been given a school student travel pass and will automatically receive a School Opal card in 2016.

### **Online eligibility assessment**

The new online application portal will automatically assess eligibility based on distance rules.

### Same eligibility rules

The eligibility rules for subsidised school travel remain the same for travel inside and outside the **Opal network.** Students may need to live a minimum distance away from their school: Years K-2—There is no minimum distance Years 3-6— 1.6 km straight line distance or 2.9 km walking distance or further.

### Who needs to apply

An application is needed if your child has not had a travel pass before or if you have changed address.

### How to apply

Step 1

Complete the application at transportnsw.info/ school-students

#### Step 2

Print, sign and date the completed application, then submit it to the school office for endorsement. **Step 3** 

The endorsed application will then be sent from the school office to Transport for NSW. Once approved, the School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.

### AFL Years K-6

The AFL is hosting a 4 week after-school AFL program for Our Lady of Lourdes students in Years K-6 on Fridays starting in Week 7. The program is completely optional for children/parents to


