This Sunday is the Fifth Sunday of Lent – Year C

The Gospel reading for this Sunday is from John 8:1-11.

Let the person without sin be the first to throw a stone.

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. At daybreak he appeared in the Temple again; and as all the people came to him, he sat down and began to teach them. The scribes and Pharisees brought a woman along who had been caught committing adultery; and making her stand there in full view of everybody, they said to Jesus, 'Master, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery, and Moses has ordered us in the Law to condemn women like this to death by stoning. What have you to say?' They asked him this as a test, looking for something to use against him. But Jesus bent down and started wr' 'iting on the ground with his finger. As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said, 'If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.' Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again. When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman, who remained standing there. He looked up and said, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' 'No one, sir,' she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus 'go away, and don't sin any more.'

Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

The accusers of this woman make her 'stand there in full view of everybody.' She is surrounded by the hostile glare of eyes filled with blood lust.

It is only when the accusers have left in embarrassment that Jesus, who has been bent to the ground, looks up at her. He adopts the posture of a slave, seeing her as she could be if she gives up her current pattern of behaviour.

Up till now, no-one has spoken to this woman. Now Jesus treats her as a human being worth speaking to. And what does she hear? That he does not condemn her but points her to a new sort of life in the future. We could pause for a moment to allow Jesus the time to look at us, talk to us, in that way. Do you have the courage to 'lock eyes' with Jesus and live out the consequences?

'The eyes have it.'

Time from exposure to

illness: 10 to 21 days, usually 14 to 16 days.

Symptoms: Slight fever, runny nose and a rash that begins as raised pink spots that blister and scab.

Do I need to keep my child at home? Yes, for 5 days from the onset of the rash and the blisters have dried.

Road safety around your child's school Your child's safety depends on you

Drop off and pick up by car

Make sure your children are in an appropriate child car seat that is fitted and used correctly.

Stick to the 40 km/h speed limit in a school zone as children are about.

Look for buses pulling out – watch for flashing

Always park and turn legally around schools.

Avoid dangerous manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns.

Always gi**ve way** to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.

Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop off and pick up area. Calling out to them from across the road is dangerous – they may run to you without checking for traffic

It's safest for children to get out of the car on the kerb side of the road to be away from passing traffic.

Walking together to and from school

Plan your trip to school so you use pedestrian crossings where possible.

Always hold your child's hand. Children need your help to spot dangers such as vehicles coming out of driveways. They can also be easily distracted and wander into traffic

Drop off and pick up your child near the school gate and avoid calling them from across the road.

Talk with your children about Stop, Look, Listen and Think every time they cross the road.

STOP I one step back from the kerb.

LOOK! for traffic to your right left and right again.
LISTEN! for the sounds of approaching traffic.
THINK! whether it is safe to cross.

Young children can learn these safe pedestrian habits from you and continue them later on when they are old enough to travel alone.






Religion in Year Four


Lent is a time in the liturgical year where we can establish or continue to develop practices of prayer, self-denial and almsgiving.

In Religious Education we study the parable of the 'The Lost Sheep' and 'The Lost Coin' to identify that the season of Lent is a season that challenges us to be a better person and invites us to reconcile with God and others.

Through these scriptures we recognise that Jesus procalaimed God's forgiveness in His words and in His actions. God will always forgive us because He loves us. He will always be there for us, like the shepherd to his sheep, and will guide us on our journey back home. We can also recognise in these scriptures that we, as a community, celebrate God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance. Through this sacrament we can reconcile our relationship with God, self and others.

These parables can be classed as 'Parables of Mercy', linking heavily to our Year of Mercy focus for this year.









Into The Forestii

On Friday 4th March, Year 5 went to visit the Royal National Park as a way of experiencing a rainforest first hand.

We learned more about the layers in the rainforest, food chains and how some animals can be a threat to the forest itself.

We foraged for invertebrates on the forest floor and dipped nets into Bola Creek to see what kind of tiny creatures lived there.






