Parent/Teacher Interviews

Parent/Teacher interviews will commence for all
classes next week. Please be aware that at the Parent/
Teacher Interviews, children will not be supervised
by teachers. If they do come along with their parents
they must wait inside the classroom during the
interview.

School Hours

Many children are arriving after the morning bell on
a regular basis and missing valuable lessons. Part
absences are noted on the roll which is retained by
the school as an official record of absences. It would
be appreciated if routine dental appointments etc
could be made outside of school hours. If a child is
frequently late, parents will be contacted by a
member of the Executive.

After School

A reminder to all parents that the afternoon bell is
rung at 3.10pm. There are several children, on a
regular basis, who are not collected till well after
3.30pm. At times there are traffic accidents which
cause parents to be late in collecting children. On
these occasions, the school will look after the
remaining students. It would be appreciated if you
could enrol your children in after-school care as the
staff are engaged in meetings.

Absences

School attendance is obligatory for all children
between the ages of 6 and 17. If your child is absent
for short periods due to medical reasons, and you
know of the intended absence in advance, please
advise the school in writing. Please note that if your
child is absent from school for any other reasons,
written notification must be sent to the class teacher.
Where parents are planning to take their children out
of school for holidays or family circumstances they
need to collect an '**Application for Exemption
from Attendance from School**' form. The principal
may grant permission in writing for this leave.
Please apply for this exemption well in advance of
the anticipated date(s) of the absence.

**The School Census will take place on the 1st
August.** If you are aware that your child will be
absent from school on this date, it would be
appreciated if you could notify the school in writing
as soon as possible.

Religious Education in the Classroom – Year 6

Term 2 has been a very busy time for Year 6. In week 1, they went to the Imax Theatre, Saint Mary's Cathedral and the Crypt. On the 28th May, they were fortunate enough to go on another excursion to the Art Gallery and Mary MacKillop Museum.

The experiences of visiting Saint Mary's Cathedral, the Crypt and Mary MacKillop Museum were very rewarding and provided the students with valuable information. This became an introduction to the unit currently being studied in Religion - *'The Story of the Catholic Church in Australia'*.

This *'Sharing Our Story'* unit has been designed to develop the students' understanding and appreciation of some significant characters and events that have shaped the identity and growth of the Catholic community in Australia.

Some of these are:

- *The arrival of the First Fleet in 1788. Of the 1,044 convicts who arrived, 316 were Catholics. For some years there were no priests or religious in the settlement, so the laity assumed responsibility for 'keeping the faith alive'.

- *The first Mass was celebrated in Australia on 15th May, 1803 by Father Dixon, a convict priest.

- *In 1820 Fathers Therry and Conolly were the first priests to minister officially to Catholics in the country.

- *In 1835 John Bede Polding was appointed as Australia's first Catholic Bishop. He set out to establish a Benedictine Monastery, to provide efficient administrators to set up dioceses and respond to the pastoral needs of the community.

- *In 1838 the Sisters of Charity were the first religious order from overseas to be invited to set up communities to work with the Catholic people. Caroline Chisholm also arrived in this year.

The students have become aware of the richness of the various cultural expressions of Catholicism that make up the Australian Church today.
