Family Support Work (children 0-12 yrs) with professional, qualified Family Workers and Parenting Coaches. We can assist you if you have a child aged 0 -12 years old, as an individual, couple, family, carer, playgroup, pre-school, primary school or community group to raise healthy happy children. Together we explore the strengths and skills you have within your family by identifying any changes or improvements you would like to make, as well as setting goals and/or locating specialist services as required.

Family Support Work (Youth 13-18yrs) for parents and carers of young people who are facing a range of barriers that are affecting their relationships, education, health and wellbeing.

Our Family Worker support provides assistance through individual Family Support, Parenting workshops, and flexible group work programs for young people.

Community Development providing families with children from birth to 8 years opportunities to connect to their community, increase their social networks with other local parents and participate in activities that assist parents to be effectively involved in their children's early development and learning through fun play based activities.

Multicultural Women's Support Group in a relaxed friendly, fun environment, providing Multicultural women with children from birth to 12 years opportunities to increase their relationships with other local women, participate in a engaging programs that can assist with your child's education and development and help you to learn more about other support services in your local community.

Financial Counselling Services providing free independent and confidential face-to-face counselling. Our professional financial counsellors can help you if you are in financial difficulty or would like to manage your money more effectively. They can provide short-term crisis management and long-term prevention strategies.

Expressive Therapy Service offers mental wellbeing to children and young people aged between 5 -15 years old, who are seeking help for emotional support and growth in their lives. It is an individual and/or group therapeutic counselling program delivered by an experienced Art Therapy practitioner of 15 years. The service provides young people with the tools and support they need to gain the confidence to overcome crisis in their lives.
