## **Head Lice**

There has been a report of head lice at the school. Please check your child for signs of lice or nits (small white eggs on the hair shaft). It is recommended that each child be thoroughly examined and treated at home if necessary. Check your child's hair for live lice and either yellowish white eggs (live nits) or brown or black eggs (dead nits)

Hatched eggs are white and flat, like grains of salt or dandruff. Consult your local pharmacy about which product is best suited for your child.

Re-treatment should be carried out about 7 days after the first treatment to kill off any juvenile lice that may have hatched since the first treatment.

Remove eggs and lice by using a metal comb and egg remover or combing solution.

Use lice soaking solution to clean all pillows, linen etc to avoid re-infestation.

Time from infestation to eggs hatching: Usually 5 to 7 days

Symptoms: Itchy scalp, white specks stuck near the base of the hairs, lice may be found on the scalp.

Do I need to keep my child home?: No, as long as head lice management is ongoing.

How can I help prevent spread? Family, friends and classroom contacts should be examined and managed if infested.

## **Facts on lice**

- Head lice are parasites that suck blood and live exclusively on humans
- Head lice don't hop or fly, 95% of lice are transmitted by close contact
- Don't share hats, headbands & pillows
- Especially common among school children between the ages of 3-12 yrs
- Head lice don't like short and plaited hair
- Girls have more chance of infestation because of their long hair
- Items that come in contact with an infested person (i.e. hair brushes, bands, ribbons, hats) must be washed in hot water with an appropriate soaking solution (obtained from the chemist) and then sun dried

# Parish News



## *Golden Jubilee of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish Baulkham Hills*

Our Lady of Lourdes Parish will be celebrating their Golden Jubilee in October. As part of their celebrations they are including “snippets from the past” in their weekly bulletin.

### **Parish Memories 1969 – 2019 Mass in the School of Arts–“Good Old Days” Paul Turner**

There was a Mission in the old St Monica’s Church in about 1948. My mother, Clarice Turner (who passed away in 1981 on the day of the first anniversary of the opening of our Church, OLOL). She spoke to the mission priests about the number of Italian and Maltese market gardeners in Model Farms (now Winston Hills).

It was decided to celebrate Mass at 7.00am on Sundays at the School of Arts Hall on Windsor Road, at about the site of the M2 commuter car park. The Altar was a piano. The Altar rails were two long benches. The people sat on long wooden seating. When it rained, the hall would leak in places. If there had been a wedding reception on the night before, the hall would smell heavily of sardines and beer!

In the small entrance room was a small counter. Jack Higgs (Cate Linnane’s dad) would be selling the Catholic Weekly. He would have a “Roll-your own” hanging from his lip, discussing football and his beloved Eels with all comers. Each person entering the hall was greeted by name. If there was one person whose name he did not know, he would enquire about the name, and then next week that person would be greeted by name.

The market garden families arrived in their trucks with all their children standing or seated in the back. There was a small room on the left of the hall which was used by the Racing pigeon club. On the right was the Library, and behind that was the large kitchen, and probably a few small site rooms as well. Behind the stage was a billiard room which had been destroyed by a storm long before 1950, and the floor survived.

The School of Arts was built in 1918 and contained the Library. It burned down in 1978. Parish Memories from Anne Dikeman as one of the first catechists in 1969. Father Kelly was sourcing parishioners to commence teaching in the public schools within Our Lady of Lourdes Parish (two in 1969). This involved a weekly visit to the school, having prepared your own lesson and suitable work sheets for the children. Catholic children from kindergarten to sixth class attended the weekly, hourly lesson, so I made it age adaptable. On average about 35 children attended the weekly class, which grew each term. Parents were kept notified via word of mouth and handouts, of parish events, especially First Communion dates.

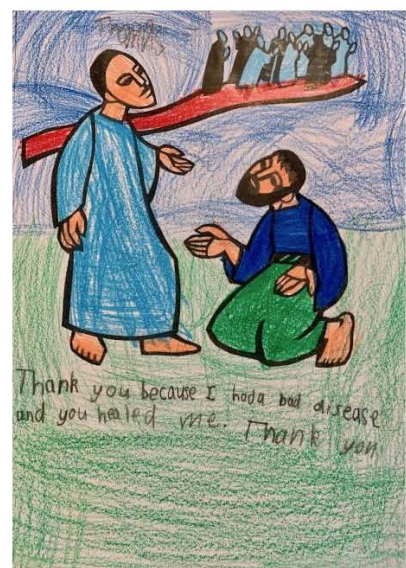
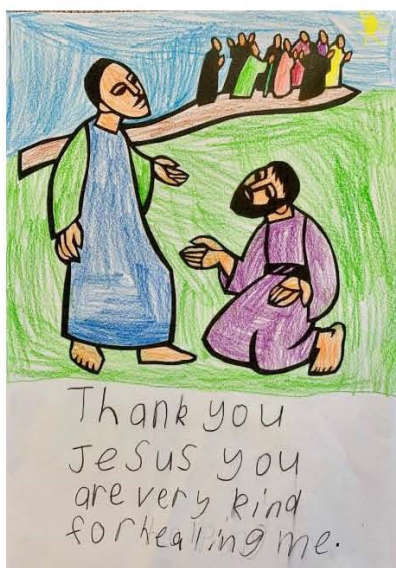
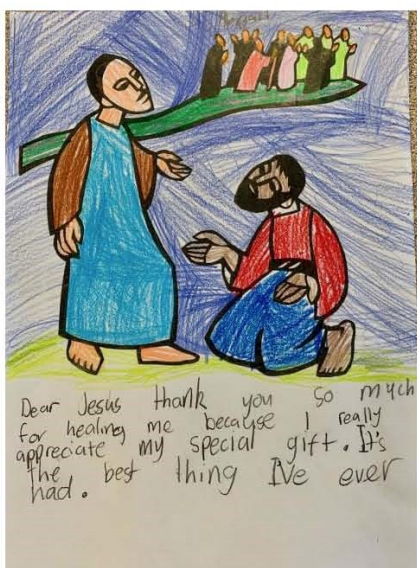


# Religious Education in Year 1

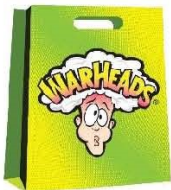
